

About Portraits of Trees

I've been practicing noticing and appreciating the mundane things in my life. Doing this, I find, relieves stress and helps me maintain my curiosity and joy of living. Recently I noticed that I'd been seeing the beautiful trees in my neighborhood without really paying attention.

So, I decided to create portraits of some of them so I could enjoy their shapes, colors and "moods" - their personalities, so to speak. I selected six trees and made 24 portraits by hand using ink, watercolor, gouache and color pencil. These portraits are tiny, only 3.5 x 2.5 inches, and I did them over several months, one at a time, while looking out my windows during breakfast.

Also, as part of my effort to notice and pay attention to my neighborhood trees - or "my neighbor trees" as I called them - I read several books, stories and poems related to trees. I've listed some of them in the back of this book.

Below you see one of the views outside my window. In the second photo you're seeing of one of my tree portraits during breakfast.
































































